CAMP & ENRICHMENT PROGRAM

WAIVER, INDEMNIFICATION, AND MEDICAL TREATMENT AUTHORIZATION FORM

1. **EXCULPATORY CLAUSE.** In consideration for receiving permission for my/my child's participation in any and all activities of Youth Adventure Program (herein referred to as "camp"), which is sponsored by Dept. of Educational Psychology, (herein referred to as "sponsor"), I hereby release, waive, discharge, covenant not to sue, and agree to hold harmless for any and all purposes sponsor, The Texas A&M University System, the Board of Regents for The Texas A&M University System, Texas A&M University, and their members, officers, servants, agents, volunteers, or employees (herein referred to as **RELEASEES** or **INDEMNITEES**) from any and all liabilities, claims, demands, injuries (including death), or damages, including court costs and attorney's fees and expenses, that may be sustained by me/my child while participating in such activity, while traveling to and from the activity, or while on the premises owned or leased by **RELEASEES**, including injuries sustained as a result of the sole, joint, or concurrent negligence, negligence per se, statutory fault, or strict liability of RELEASEES. I understand this waiver does not apply to injuries caused by intentional or grossly negligent conduct.

2. **INDEMNITY CLAUSE.** I am fully aware that there are inherent risks to my child, myself and others involved with this activity, including but not limited to swimming, recreational sports (basketball, soccer, etc.), field games, and I choose to voluntarily participate/allow my child to in said activity with full knowledge that the activity may be hazardous to me, my child and my property, and to the person and property of others. I acknowledge there may be physically strenuous activities. I know of no medical reason why I/my child should not participate. I agree to indemnify and hold harmless INDEMNITEES from any and all liabilities, claims, demands, injuries (including death), or damages, including court costs and attorney's fees and expenses, which may occur to myself, my child, other participants, and third-persons as a result of my/my child's participation in said activity, including injuries sustained as a result of the sole, joint, or concurrent negligence, negligence per se, statutory fault, or strict liability of INDEMNITEES.

3. **NO INSURANCE.** I understand that **RELEASEES** may or may not maintain any insurance policy covering any circumstance arising from my/my child's participation in this activity or any event related to that participation. As such, I am aware that I should review my personal insurance coverage. Organization may not carry general liability insurance to cover claims arising from this activity so it seeks a waiver of claims as additional consideration for the right to participate so organization, can (a) provide the activity at the lowest possible cost to participants; and (b) provide access to a greater number of participants by expending limited resources on program materials rather than on liability insurance.

4. **BINDS HEIRS.** It is my express intent that this agreement shall bind the members of my family and spouse, if I am alive, and my heirs, assigns and personal representatives, if I am deceased, and shall be governed by the laws of the State of Texas.

5. **MEDICAL AUTHORIZATION, INDEMNITY FOR MEDICAL EXPENSES, and WAIVER.** I understand **RELEASEES** cannot be expected to control all of the risks articulated in this form and **RELEASEES** may need to respond to accidents and potential emergency situations. Therefore, I hereby give my consent for any medical treatment that may be required, as determined by a medical professional at the medical facility, during my/my child's participation in this activity with the understanding that the cost of any such treatment will be my responsibility.

I agree to indemnify and hold harmless INDEMNITEES for any costs incurred to treat me/my child, even if an INDEMNITEE has signed hospital documentation promising to pay for the treatment due to my inability to sign the documentation. I further agree to release, waive, discharge, covenant not to sue, and agree to hold harmless for any and all purposes, RELEASEES from any and all liabilities, claims, demands, injuries (including death), or damages, including court costs and attorney's fees and expenses, that may be sustained by me/my child while receiving medical care or in deciding to seek medical care, including while traveling to and from a medical care facility, including injuries sustained as a result of the sole, joint, or concurrent negligence, negligence per se, statutory fault, or strict liability of RELEASEES. I understand this waiver does not apply to injuries caused by intentional or grossly negligent conduct.

6. VOLUNTARY SIGNATURE. In signing this agreement I acknowledge and represent that I have read it, understand it, and sign it voluntarily as my own free act and deed; sponsor has not made and I have not relied on any oral representations, statements, or inducements apart from the terms contained in this agreement. I execute this document for full, adequate and complete consideration fully intending to be bound by the same, now and in the future. I understand I can choose not to sign this document and free myself and my child from its terms and the associated risks of the activity by simply not participating in the activity and choosing some other activity available to me/my child that has a lower level of risk to myself and my child. I further understand this is a voluntary, extracurricular activity. While I understand alternative activities are available to me/my child that do not have the risks associated with this activity I still desire to voluntarily engage/permit my child to engage in this activity.

AGREEMENT

2010 Youth Adventure Program Rules

1. Leave the dorm only with permission of the Camp Manager unless you are leaving for a class/planned activity with your professor. A student may not leave the dorm or classroom area without knowledge of a YAP counselor and may not leave with anyone other than a YAP staff member unless prior arrangements have been made.
2. Boys are not allowed in girls' rooms in the dorm, and girls are not allowed in boys' rooms. Neither is allowed in college students' rooms.
3. Alcohol, drugs and tobacco products are not allowed and will result in the student being sent home.
4. Fighting, harsh teasing, taunting, and hazing are unacceptable. No violence or hurtful behaviors of any kind will be tolerated.
5. Engaging in inappropriate physical or sexual conduct (to be defined by, but not be limited to: sitting on laps, giving neck/back massages, pursuing unwanted advances, etc.) disruptive to other campers or the camp environment is prohibited.
6. Music depicting or suggesting violence is not appropriate. Inappropriate music will be confiscated by YAP personnel and returned at checkout. Any personal music players (stereos, iPods, etc.) may be brought, but may not be taken to class. All music must be kept at an appropriate listening level that does not bother others.
7. Ask permission before borrowing the possessions of another student / roommate.
8. Attend and be on time for all camp classes and activities.
9. Personal hygiene is important in our hot weather. YAP students are responsible for showering, washing hair, and keeping themselves clean and neat for their camp stay.
10. Be in your dorm room for room check and stay there unless you have an emergency. You need to be ready for class each morning, so the curfews are in place for a reason.
11. The use of profanity is not allowed.
12. Wear clothing appropriate for a school setting.
13. Campers who come to camp with cell phones are responsible for them. They are only to be used while the student is back at the dorm (morning, lunch, dinner, evening) or during downtime (i.e. not when class or group recreation activities are in session). Cell phones that are used improperly will be taken up by the camp staff and returned at the end of the week.
14. Televisions, personal gaming systems, and movie players will not be allowed. Items will be taken up at check-in if brought. Computers are allowed, but only for class-related purposes (not IM, movies, video games, etc.). Please plan accordingly.
15. Campers are expected to display a respectful and cooperative attitude toward all University and YAP personnel. Additionally, campers are expected to show respect for the institution as a whole, including traditions, academic integrity, and all Aggies. Gig'em!

Rule infractions will result in either dorm room grounding during recreation and evening activities or being sent home early without refund, depending on the severity of the infraction. The camp manager and/or camp director will determine consequences.

YAP Behavior Contract
